4.1 Course - Program Applicable Status

"Program Applicable" status means that a course will be included in an existing or new degree or certificate program. If there isn't a current program or certificate, do not mark the course as "Program Applicable." New courses must be submitted to the curriculum workflow alongside any modifications to existing programs or new program proposals. Note: Faculty must include new courses as placeholders in their programs before submitting them to the workflow with the new course(s).

4.2 CCN Phase 1 Approval Timeline

- First CCN Phase 1 courses will go to Board of Trustees for review on November 17th
- Courses must be locally, and state approved by December 1st
- At the end of the CCN catalog and schedule description the former title of the course will be listed as a reference (i.e., formerly ENG 001A.

- 4.6 Chancellor's Office Approval Time Frame:
 - Two staff members are reviewing programs for the 116 Community Colleges.
- The Chancellor's Office approval timeline has increased from 60 days to
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90 to 100 or more days due to limited staff.

- For programs that are submitted and returned for revisions the approval window of 90 to 100 or more days starts over.
- As a result of the COCI maintenance closure and approval time frame, programs may not be approved by a desired effective term. Faculty need to monitor their email from the Curriculum Team (Chair, Articulation Officer and Curriculum Specialists) and prepare to make program revisions on a short timeline as needed.
