# Addendum 1.

Faculty Senate Resolution re: Description of Course Textbooks on the Course Outline of Record (COR)

Whereas, the rising cost of course textbooks has been of increasing concern for the past two decades and has been discussed in the California Legislature and the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges in several position papers and resolutions since 1997<sup>1</sup>;

Whereas, the Faculty Senate of the College of the Desert has recognized the need for action in reducing the cost of textbooks for students by creating a "Textbook Affordability Task Force" and by holding a Faculty Forum<sup>2</sup> to discuss this problem on Oct. 23, 2008;

Whereas, multiple textbook selections described on the Course Outline of Record engenders confusion for everyone who reviews the CORs including Curriculum Committee members, librarians, and bookstore personnel and results in hours of wasted staff time;

Whereas, there has been a long-standing practice at the College of the Desert where faculty in all subject areas will select ONE textbook to be used by instructors of all sections of that course;

Whereas, students who review CORs to determine the cost of the textbooks and materials used for a class should not have to be confused by a list of textbooks, some which will serve as the primary textbook and others which are listed as alternative choices or suggested readings;

# Therefore, be it resolved:

It will be the policy of the Faculty Senate of the College of the Desert to urge faculty to be cognizant of the prohibitively expensive cost of course textbooks and to help to reduce the costs to students of buying textbooks by selecting ONE current or essential textbook to be used in all sections of courses which use textbooks, and to list these textbooks on Number 6 "Textbooks, Required Reading or Software" in the Course Outline of Record;.

It will further be the policy of the Faculty Senate to encourage faculty to use existing resources at the College of the Desert to make course materials available to students without charge (E.g., COD Library Course Reserves, Open Educational Resources (OER), technological solutions, etc.).
