2.5 1st Reading Resolution 1.79 Emergency Distance Education

Addendum and Online Instruction Training (through Dec 31, 2020)

Motion: M Gladych, 2nd

Discussion:

- Need to plan ahead should courses not be able to be conducted on campus due to government restrictions as recommended by ASCCC
- The emergency blanket was issued for spring not fall and we need to be prepared for fall if no new blanket is issued
- Courses must be approved for online delivery and this addendum covers that option
- Many CalState and community colleges have already moved to online for fall
- Does not indicate courses must be taught online which is a determination between faculty and deans.
- Some courses not designed to be online, such as trades
- Suggestion to add "hybrid" modality
- Currently students are not allowed on campus and only a few people are designated as essential.
- Some certificate programs require face-to-face because of agency requirements
- It appears some flexibility has been granted elsewhere or are others disregarding government restrictions
- If courses are not DE approved, they cannot be offered, and students cannot receive financial aid
- Need disaster preparedness
- Can certain areas be exempt, i.e. PSA

- May need consideration of a resolution to administration for option to offer face to face with appropriate precautions and social distancing.
- Nursing is in support of resolution and has been putting in many hours to make current situation work and looking at options. Not ideal and must also work with boards. Students touch patients, work with children. Some have been able to have clinical hours by helping with CoVid testing.
- Arts & Media students need access to some equipment needed
- State regulations for fire academy have specific SLOs, course objectives, and specific skills mandated by state fire marshall. Other colleges have been conducting fire academies with social distancing. Special permission given for hybrid until July 1 at all 35 academies with 22 currently using hybrid.
- Need to look at alternatives or outcomes that might not be met
- Several suggestions shared such as using incomplete and offering future hands-on follow-up.
- Resolution doesn't limit any negotiations for face to face
- May need to prioritize and some classes may need to not be offered or scheduled in fall
