TITLE: OUT-OF-STATE/COUNTRY TRAVEL

BACKGROUND:

1. Administrative Services – Ms. Janet Villeneuve, Financial Analyst of Fiscal Services, to attend the 2014 Federal Student Aid (FSA) Training Conference in Atlanta, GA, on December 2-5, 2014.

The FSA Training Conference for Financial Aid Professionals is the largest training program in the United States serving the financial aid community, and ultimately the students and families seeking an education beyond high school. This conference is not for government employees, but it is training provided for financial aid professionals by the government for those schools/institutions receiving Title IV funds. FSA provides more than \$150 billion of federal Title IV funds in grants, loans, and work-study programs to more than 14 million students. By law, schools are accountable to abide by and comply with the rules and regulations of the Title IV programs they administer. Ensuring the proper training of these institutions disbursing these funds is an investment in protecting the taxpayer dollars from fraud, waste, and abuse.

The Conference sessions will focus on topics related to changes in Title IV regulations and legislation such as protecting students' privacy and their loan data, Gainful Employment rules, 150% Direct Loan subsidized Limitation, Loan repayment Options, as well as changes to the Clery Act and the protection of students, violence against women, and sexual assaults on campus. Financial Aid Professionals will also learn how to implement these changes at their schools, and will be able to practice fact-to-fact, hands-on using the student loan data systems. There will also be staple sessions like new changes to the FAFSA, Verification, and Pell Grants as well as sessions on cash management and loan reconciliation.

Fiscal Implications: Costs estimated at \$1,510.00 and will be funded by a restricted source (Auxiliary Funds).

2. Student Success and Student Learning – Dr. David George, Professor in Business, School of Applied Sciences and Business, to attend the National Association for Community College Entrepreneurship Conference in Phoenix, AZ, on October 12-15, 2014.

Attending this meeting will directly improve Dr. George's teaching approach in the College's Small Business Development and Management Courses, as well as, generate new ideas for the proposed Entrepreneurship Program. Overall professional goal is currency in this various

discipline area. This activity would provide a significant currency boost in the small business area where Dr. George is the Lead Instructor.

<u>Fiscal Implications:</u> Costs estimated at \$1,929.00 and will be funded by a restricted fund (Faculty Development) and an unrestricted source (General Fund).

3. Student Success and Student Learning – Dr. Lisa Soccio, Gallery Director for Walter N. Marks Center for the Arts, and Ms. Krystal Glasman, Gallery Assistant, to attend and present at the Western Museum Association Annual Conference in Las Vegas, NV, on October 5-8, 2014. The presentation is on October 7, 2014.

The Western Museums Association (WMA) is a nonprofit, membership organization dedicated to serving museums, museum professionals, as well as the related organizations and individuals, by providing vision, enrichment, intellectual challenge, and a forum for communication and interaction. The WMA is primarily comprised of members across the Western states of Alaska, Arizona, California, Hawaii, Idaho, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, and Washington. The WMA conference provides opportunities for learning and personal interaction to enhance the creative skills and enrich the lives of individuals who do museum work.

The presentation will highlight *Declarations: Our Message to the World*, an exhibition conceived by the Spring 2013 C.O.D. Gallery Management class and featured at the Marks Art Center Fall 2013. The most inspiring, and educational aspect of this exhibition was the community involvement it fostered.

Fiscal Implications: Costs estimated at \$1,900.00 and will be funded by an unrestricted source (Marks Art Center Budget).

4. Student Success & Student Learning: Dr. Wendy Hinrichs Sanders, Early Childhood Education (ECE) Professor, School of Health Sciences and Education, to attend the International Step by Step Association 2014 Conference in Budapest, Hungary, on October 10-12, 2014, to present a workshop inviting participants from the Eastern European countries to help construct teaching activities legends, sons, activities, values, sayings, greetings, books, etc. for the COD ECE course, "Teaching in a Diverse Society" (ECE 45).

The International Step by Step Association is a collection of former Soviet Bloc countries, from Czech Republic to Maldova and the conference attracts participants from all over the world. The Association was formed by the US Open Society group to help new democracies teach democratic values and practices beginning at an early age.

Sanders teaches the ECE course and is writing an iBook that will be available, at the minimum, as a Course Reader for ECE students. This relatively new course, taught in all Curriculum Alignment Project (CAP) accredited community colleges in California does not have texts that cover all the student learning outcomes. The iBook is intended to be available to students at our campus and around the world for less than \$5. This conference and workshop will enable her to gather primary research samples for the course text and collect teaching materials for her course

(90 students per year) that would not otherwise be accessible to her. We have a small block of ECE students who have come from Eastern Europe.

<u>Fiscal Implications:</u> Costs estimated at \$2,300.00. \$800.00 will be funded by a restricted source (Faculty Development) and \$1,500.00 will be funded by Dr. Hinrichs Sanders.

BACKGROUND:

C-0000452 – Farnsworth Group – Applied Sciences Project

Amendment No. 2 for LEED Consulting Services extends the original contract end date to January 31, 2015. This is an extension of time only and does not amend the original scope of work and comes at no additional cost to the District.

C-0000526 – MSA Consulting, Inc. – Athletic Facilities Project

Amendment No. 1 for SWPP Monitoring Services extends the original contract end date to December 31, 2014. This is an extension of time only and does not amend the original scope of work and comes at no additional cost to the District.

C-0000671 – JBA Consulting Engineers – Athletic Facilities Project

Amendment No. 2 for Technology Consulting Services amends the original scope of work to provide documentation to add a Public Address system to the gymnasium and fitness center. This amendment is an increase in the amount not to exceed \$1,600.00. This amends the original contract amount from \$35,050.00 to a revised amount not to exceed \$36,650.00.

C-0000601 – RBF Consulting – Athletic Facilities Project

Amendment No. 2 for Construction Surveying Services extends the original contract end date to December 31, 2014 and amends the original scope of work to provide additional construction surveying services that is required to complete Phase 2 of the project. The original contact with RBF Consulting encompassed only the work in Phase 1 (Gym) of the Athletics Project. This Amendment extends the contact to cover the scope of work included in Phase 2 (Tennis Courts) and includes the staking and surveying redesign needs for over excavation of 8 tennis courts instead of the original planned 6 courts. This amendment is an increase in the amount not to

exceed \$17,515.00. This amends the original contract amount from \$44,700.00 to a revised amount not to exceed \$62,215.00.

C-0000378 – HMC Architects – Child Development Center Project

Amendment No. 6 extends the original contract end date to December 31, 2014. This is an extension of time only and does not amend the original scope of work and comes at no additional cost to the District.
