As explained in more detail in the attached Addendum drafted by Terra Nova Planning and Research, last year the Board of Trustees certified an Environmental Impact Report ("EIR") for the West Valley Campus Master Plan and commenced proceeding to acquire the Palm Spring Mall property. In an effort to expedite its ability to provide classes at the West Valley Campus site, the District is moving forward with efforts to establish an interim modular campus on an adjoining parcel located on the corner of the Baristo Road and Farrell Drive.

The proposed action is to amend the EIR to incorporate information regarding the interim campus. Terra Nova has studied the impacts of the proposed interim modular campus and determined that the initial EIR fully analyzed and mitigated all potentially significant impacts of the interim campus, and recommends that the Board adopts Resolution #042117-2 that finds the potential impacts of the interim campus have been studied in compliance with CEQA and that an addendum to the EIR is an appropriate document for disclosing the minor changes and additions that are necessary to the EIR for the interim campus.

Individuals holding designed positions shall file their statements with the District, which will make the statements available for public inspection and reproduction (Government Code Section 81008). All statements will be retained by the District.

The amendments provide for non-substantive revisions to position titles for positions that manage public investments and the inclusion / exclusion of added / deleted positions from the previous report.
