TITLE: MEMORANDUMS OF UNDERSTANDING

BACKGROUND:

Two memorandums of understanding (MOU)* between College and the Desert:

- 1. <u>Vivature, Inc.</u> The Vivature program is a fully supported, comprehensive system of billing insurance plans for clinical services provided by the Certified Athletic Trainers and team physicians of College of the Desert. The system does <u>not</u> bill students. The Vivature contact enables the Athletic Training Department to supplement its budget at no cost to the college. This is a cost neutral contract. Student insurance of the college (SAIN) will not be billed for any of the services. There is no foreseeable increase in the premium of the existing student insurance program due to this contract. The program also supplies a very comprehensive injury tracking software, Nextt, to the athletic training staff. This will allow the athletic training staff to keep more thorough records and maintain compliance with HIPPA. This is a pilot program, and if successful, the Student Health Center may consider using the same system.
- 2. Palm Springs Unified School District | Dual Enrollment Program The purpose of the Dual Enrollment Partnership is to afford current high school students the opportunity to enroll in dual-credit courses to expand student access to affordable higher education, provide challenging academic and occupational experiences to qualified high school students during their junior and senior years, and reduce the costs of a college education for students and their families. Successful completion of transfer courses will enable students to simultaneously earn college credit transferable to two-and four-year colleges and universities and satisfy high school graduation requirements. Successful completion of occupational courses will allow students to simultaneously earn college credits, to satisfy high school graduation requirements, and to assist in the transition to the community college or job opportunities or careers.

The HACU 27th Annual Conference will offer workshops and plenary sessions under the theme "Championing Hispanic Higher Education Success: Securing the American Dream".
