3. Group Discussion			
3.1 Refine Goals			
DICUSSION	 Dr. Ralston started off by reviewing the goals this committee set for themselves last year (copy attached). One of the goals was to create a workgroup to collaborate on Math and English; the challenge has been to set a meeting that fits into everyone's busy schedule. It was suggested that the committee start as a smaller group. The following people agreed to meet at an initial meeting: Ryan Woll; Gabriel Fajardo; Marie Perotti; and Karen Tabor. They agreed that the best day and time to meet is on a Wednesday or Thursday at 1:00 p.m. Ryan Woll will host the first meeting. 		

We do have a Reading, English and Math pilot project that is getting started at Shadow Hills High School that will serve as a model on how to move forward.
Dr. Ralston reported that the Common Assessment tool being developed by the State of California to help with college assessment and placement has been delayed again, which creates a big challenge. She would like this to be the one of the top conversations for the group this year to have a shared understanding of what's going on with this. She added that she would like everyone to take the assessment test anonymously.
One of the goals was schedule synchronization. College of the Desert (COD) changed their start dates for summer school, which allowed more high school seniors to attend summer school at COD. More work towards effective scheduling continues.
This fall we had our largest offering of dual and concurrent enrollment classes. COD also moved up their registration schedule for Fall classes from July to May. While that worked well for COD, it did not work as well for the high schools for their dual enrollment classes. There will be future discussions on how to make the scheduling work more effectively for everyone.
Last year there was also discussion on articulated counseling, outreach and support consistency. Amanda Phillips was applauded for her counseling staff's work with the EDGE program and High School Days on campus.
Dr. Ralston handed out 3x5 cards to everyone to do a quiet assessment and get some feedback on how to help refine our goals. She asked everyone to respond if we should continue to move forward with the goals identified last year. Last year was more about COD. This year she would like it to be more about the school districts.
Dr. Ralston handed out a second set of 3x5 cards and asked the group to list what they feel needs to be prioritized this year.
A communication workgroup was formed to address some of the challenges in continuing to work more effectively due to our different time structures, cultural differences, personnel changes, etc. The following people agreed to be on this workgroup: Pamela Ralston, Amy Spears, Kevin Bibo, Michelle Valenzuela, Michelle Bleza, Sal Becerra and Adrian Torres.
Dr. Ralston would like to discuss in the future ways to reduce redundancy across districts and agencies, e.g. data collection. It would be helpful to share this information collectively.
