



Traditional RN Program Multi Criteria Selection Process Worksheet

Admission criteria to the ADN program is based on a multi-criteria screening and ranking as authorized by the California Community College Chancellor's office and the California Board of Registered Nursing. Applicants must meet all program eligibility requirements before being considered for multiple criteria. Students earn points according to the criteria below. Applicants with the highest points are offered seats to the ADN program. **All documentation/verification must be uploaded with application by the application deadline.**

1. Grade Point Average in relevant course work. Students can earn points for both sections A and B. Courses in section B are not required for program eligibility but are general education (GE) requirements for degree. Courses may only be used once throughout the entire application and cannot be counted toward multiple requirements. Additional Resources: Registered Nursing AS Degree Requirements	A. Minimum 2.5 GPA in Anatomy, Physiology, and Microbiology. Courses must be completed within the last 10 years. May repeat two science courses within the past seven (7) years. 2. Academic degrees or diplomas, or relevant certificates held by an applicant. Recent work or volunteer experience with direct human patient care within the past 5 years. Must have verification from human resources or employer verifying the number of hours worked and job title.	A. LVN, Respiratory Therapist, Physical Therapist, Paramedic (all with work experience ≥ 1000 hours) = 15 points a. Verification via copy of certificate or license AND paystubs or letter from employer verifying 1000 hours within the past 5 years B. BS/BA/MS/MA = 10 points (Only highest degree considered) a. Academic degrees Bachelor's degree and higher. Official Transcripts must be on file with A&R C. EMT, CNA, military healthcare provider (Medic, Corpsman, etc.) (≥ 500 hours) = 5 points a. Verification via copy of certificate or license AND paystubs or letter from employer verifying 500 hours within the past 5 years D. Graduate from a high school health academy in the Coachella Valley = 10 points a. Verification via copy of certificate or official transcripts verifying academy completion E. Relevant health care work or volunteer experience in a healthcare setting in which the RN is employed and doing direct patient care. (≥ 200 hours within past 5 years) = 3 points a. In a healthcare setting in which an RN is employed and doing direct patient care. Verification via letter verifying >100 hours within the past 5 years	25 Points

5. Languages Documented proficiency or advanced level of coursework in languages other than English. Credit for languages other than English shall be received for languages that are identified by the Chancellor's Office.	Ability to communicate in a health care setting in a language in addition to English: - Spanish = 5 Points - American Sign Language, Tagalog, Arabic, Chinese, Farsi, Russian, various languages of Indian Subcontinent and S.E. Asia or other languages = 3 points Verification via 250-500 word personal statement including the following: - How the applicant became fluent in other languages - In what situations has the applicant utilizes other languages - How often applicant utilizes other languages - How comfortable applicant would be speaking in other language utilizing medical terms in a healthcare setting	5 Points
6. Assessment/readiness test results (TEAS) Please provide a copy of your initial results with your application. Please wait to submit the official copy until you receive a verification request from ATI. Uploaded scores will remain unofficial until verified through ATI.	Points are given for composite score on FIRST ATTEMPT of Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS Version 7). Scores from subsequent tests will not be counted. 90 – 100% = 15 points 80 – 89% = 10 points 70-79% = 5 points 62 – 69% = 2 points < 62% = 0 points Ineligible for acceptance	15 points
